





New South Wales Highlights






Average duration of caring role

Which is really frustrating and heartbreaking."




Whether carers were asked about their own needs


Whether carers felt their views influenced services






"Wider recognition of informal supports is really important...I want there to be more awareness in society at large about the labour that goes into caring for loved ones."
